



How To Recycle Paint

PaintCare Inc., a non-profit organization, representing paint manufacturers in planning and operating paint stewardship programs in U.S. states and jurisdictions that pass paint stewardship laws. In states where PaintCare operates, we encourage households and businesses to take their unwanted, leftover paint to a PaintCare drop-off site.

What is Accepted

- Interior and exterior architectural paints: latex, acrylic, water-based, alkyd, oil-based, enamel (including textured coatings)
- Deck coatings, floor paints (including elastomeric)
- Primers, sealers, under-coaters
- Stains
- Shellacs, lacquers, varnishes, urethanes (single component)
- Waterproofing concrete/masonry/wood sealers and repellents (not tar or bitumen-based)
- Metal coatings, rust preventatives
- Field and lawn paints

Spray paints, aerosols, paint thinners, mineral spirits and solvents are not accepted. Containers that are leaking, empty, or without the original printed manufacturer's label are not accepted at drop-off sites.
